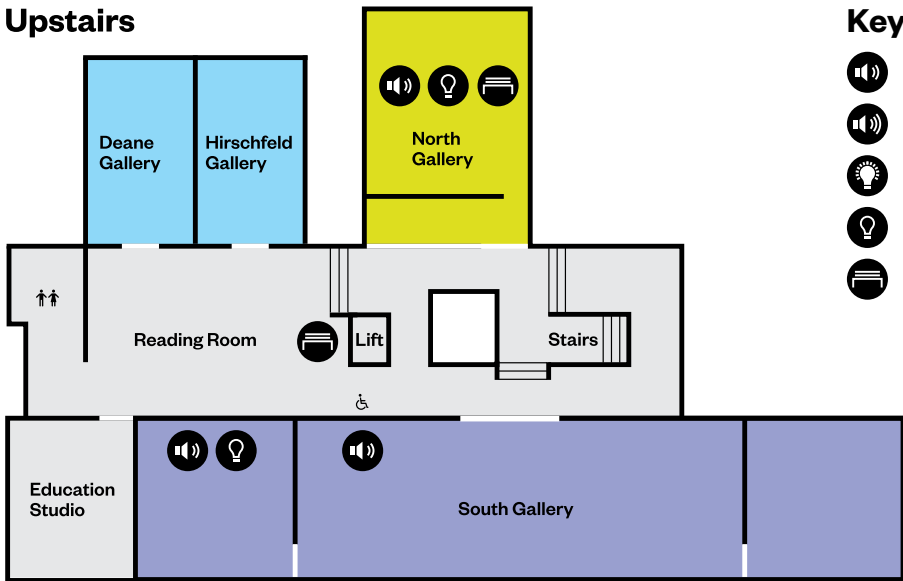


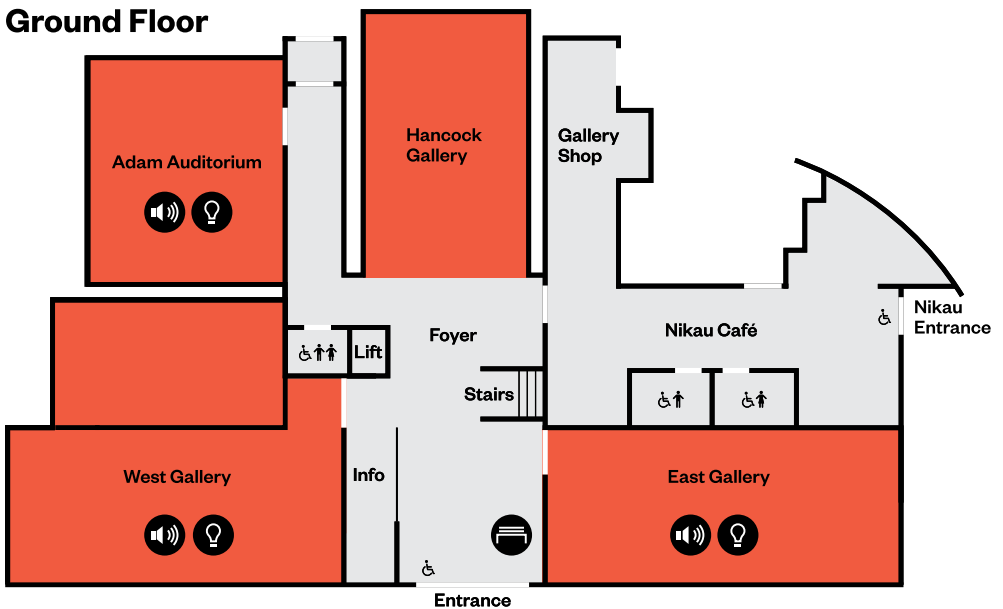

Brett Graham (Ngāti Koroki Kahukura, Tainui) is known for his large-scale sculptures exploring indigenous histories, politics, and philosophies.

Tai Moana Tai Tangata addresses the architecture of colonial warfare, the language of war memorials, and historic political pacts between Tainui and Taranaki iwi.

Judy Millar famously 'paints backwards', wiping paint off her canvases to create exaggerated, hyperactive brushstrokes that seem to float in illusionistic space. *Action Movie* presents two new series of paintings in conversation with two 'direct' films inspired by abstract expressionism.
